

# **Curatorial Process Result**

During the curatorial process of this Science Awareness, 252 Proposals from five continents (South America, North America, Europe, Asia and Africa) were analyzed, spread over 26 countries. 45 proposals from Belo Horizonte (Brazil) only.



65% of the 252 projects submitted are multiarea proposals and 75% are unpublished works. The result reflect how integrated art, science and technology productions are increasingly present in Minas Gerais, Brazil and the world.

From the 252 proposals, we arrive at 35 shortlisted proposals in a first phase and 21 shortlisted proposals in a second phase. From this selection we finalize the curatorial narrative with the following names and proposals, being six the works selected for this 1st edition of the Call for Occupation CoMciência, among these four unpublished works. We also listed five shortlisted proposals as alternates and five proposals that had an honorable mention:

# **TIME LINE**

37 days working on the analysis of all proposals

6 video-call meetings between the curators

3 face-to-face meetings for the analysis of the 35 shortlist proposals

135 hours to analysis and selection of works

#### **TEAM**

The curators team was supported by direct e-mail information to the shortlisted tenderers, and the MM Gerdau Museum staff in the final selection stage through the sector responsible for their museology, programming, communication and direction.

# **FASE DE HOMOLOGAÇÃO**

All entries were subjected to technical analysis, verifying problems and errors of proposal identification.

This phase was published on September 3rd. All proposers had 5 days to request any inconsistency from their entries.



### PREPARATION PHASE FOR ANALYSIS DOCUMENTS

- Registrations received treatment and adequacy of information, being suppressed information such as Name of the proponent, Personal data, and addresses;
- All submitted content, photos, videos, spreadsheets, links and other documents were separated by each proposal;
- After this phase, new curator access documents were produced.



### **METHODOLOGY**

#### **PRIMARY FILTER**

- 1) They were separated into two groups between Brazilian and International proposals;
- 2) Entries were separated by maximum category of subscription;



Being cohesive between the categories of this call: (points; a, b, c, d and f).

### Criterion E

Innovative, unpublished or multidisciplinary character.



#### **FINAL FILTER**

#### **Criterion 1**

Return to the critical, conceptual and strategic element of this Call based on its narrative and curatorial element (Curatorial Text with its concepts and axes).

#### **Criterion 2**

Quality Merit in the structuring of the Work and the operational technical need for the project scope.

#### **Criterion 3**

Technical and financial viability for the proposal implementation.

### **EVALUATION**

- All 252 proposals received ratings from curators;
- The results were consolidated in a new document covering all valid notations;
- Meetings and conversations established the selection of proposals that went through the pre-selected phase;
- In a final evaluation with 2 days of immersion between curators and MMGerdau staff - the 35 shortlisted proposals were revalidated and reevaluated, establishing criteria of wide concurrence among themselves.
- Six Works were consolidated in the evaluation against the criteria already listed.
- Its proponents were consulted with further evaluation questions and the Museum's counter-proposal validation regarding their initial proposals.
